## DRESS CODE

The Royal Norfolk & Suffolk Yacht Club wishes to offer a warm welcome to all guests, especially visiting yachtsmen but within the constraints of the standards of dress required by a Royal Yacht Club. As a courtesy to all Members, Visitors and Members alike are expected to maintain a standard of dress in conformity with the tradition and atmosphere of the Club which will not cause offence to others.

The following are offered as guidelines to dress within the Clubhouse.

## Dress Code Guidelines

- Swimwear, hoods, crash helmets, men's hats and shirtless attire are unacceptable. Jeans if worn, should not be torn or frayed
- Footwear must be worn at all times
- A jacket and tie is preferred in the Dining Room but smart casual attire is acceptable unless more formal attire is specified.
- Tailored shorts may be worn in the clubhouse but not in the Dining Room.

Smart Casual attire may consist of, for example for men:

A polo or other shirt, chino type trousers, yachting deck shoes, worn with jumper or sweatshirt in cooler weather.

## Mobile Phones

Members and Visitors are also reminded that Club Rules prohibit the use of mobile phones within the Bars and Dining Room of the Clubhouse. Please respect the privacy of others when using a mobile phone in other areas of the Club.
